Global Fellowship in Palliative Medicine

Why a global fellowship?

The Global Fellowship in Palliative Medicine organized by Pallium India, Trivandrum Institute of Palliative Sciences (TIPS), is aimed at creating a pool of physicians who can provide advanced palliative care to people with serious health-related suffering and to their families. WHO, 2020 in its fact sheet tells that the training for healthcare professionals in palliative care is often limited or non-existent. The situation in LMICs is often worse. The short courses available in palliative care may not equip them to deal with complex needs of the patients and families. Many of the physicians who wants to do a long term course in Palliative care is unable to do so mainly because of unavailability of such courses. Even if courses are being made available, taking absence from the present work would affect them in many ways. But they would be able to do online course. One of the shortcomings of such online courses is lack of clinical attachment where the theory is put into practice. We have designed this course in a hybrid mode with most of the theory delivered online with one month hands-on training at an affordable cost.

It is now globally accepted that palliative care is mitigation of serious health related suffering. Universal Health Coverage (UHC) demands, in addition to preventive, promotive, curative and rehabilitative measures, also palliative care. The World Health Assembly resolution 67 of 2014 has asked for integration of palliative care into all healthcare at all levels (primary, secondary, and tertiary) across the continuum of care (from the beginning of the suffering to the end).

All the guidelines and declarations in effect, seem to be mostly confined to high income countries. Low and middle income countries (LMICs) which house 84% global population have negligible access to palliative care. The elements of suffering in LMICs would be significantly different from those in higher income countries. The offered solutions also have to take into consideration the cultural and economic realities of the LMICs.

How can we change this dismal scenario?

As recommended by the World Health Organisation, this demands concurrent action on 3 measures:

- 1. Policy and implementation
- 2. Access to essential medicines, (particularly opioids) and
- 3. Education.

Without professional education any policy or legislative change will be of no consequence. This is the background in which we are initiating global fellowship in palliative medicine - to build a body of empowered professionals who can view the problems and solutions with a LMIC lens.

We hope to achieve the following objectives:

- To provide an overview of the practice of palliative care globally with special focus on LMICs.
- To facilitate research and quality improvement programs in palliative care
- 3. To impart attitude, knowledge and skills for practicing palliative care in cancer and non-cancer illness.
- 4. To ensure understanding of the ground realities of elements of suffering of people with serious health-related suffering and possible solutions with community participation.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Any doctor with MBBS or BDS with corresponding medical/ dental council registration can apply for this course. Doctors with disabilities are encouraged to apply. We reserve one seat and will provide reasonable accommodations to participate meaningfully in the program.

(In accordance with the rules of the Dental Council of India (DCI), the holder of a BDS degree will be eligible to practise palliative care in conditions associated with the oral and maxillofacial area. Under the NDPS rules of 2015, BDS with training in pain management is adequate qualification to be in-charge of a Recognised Medical Institution (RMI) to stock and dispense Essential Narcotic Drugs (END) including morphine, methadone and fentanyl).

COURSE FEES:

The course fee is **INR.40,000/-.** The fee is to be paid in full on intimation of acceptance for fellowship. Admission to the course is guaranteed only on payment of the fee.

The last date to apply for the course is **10th October**, **2023**. Completed application forms must be submitted at the end, and a screenshot kept for future reference. Applications received after 5 PM IST on 10th October 2023 will not be considered.

Seats are limited.

SELECTION PROCESS:

Applications will be reviewed by the training department and eligible candidates will be informed through email on or before **30**th **November 2023**. Upon receiving this email, the candidate will pay the fee to secure a seat for the Fellowship program. If the fee is not paid within a week, it will be assumed that the candidate is not interested and the seat will be allotted to the next eligible candidate.

DETAILS OF FELLOWSHIP COURSE:

The Global Fellowship in Palliative Medicine is a one-year hybrid course which will be conducted mostly through an online program. There will be 30 days of hands-on training, of which 21 days should be completed in Trivandrum Institute of Palliative Sciences and 9 days at another centre approved by Pallium India. It is acceptable to complete all 30 days at the Trivandrum Institute of Palliative Sciences.

At the successful completion of the Fellowship program, each candidate will receive 3 certificates:

- 1) Integrated course in Palliative Medicine (ICPM)
- 2) Master class in Palliative Medicine (MCPM)
- 3) Global Fellowship in Palliative Medicine (GFPM)
