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CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

As we report to you on our activities during the financial year from April 2022 to March 2023, we have some achievements that we cherish, like the institutional award from the 'International Association for Hospice and Palliative Care' and the membership in the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) with Consultative status. But let me try to avoid that temptation and focus on our mission - our mission of working towards relief from serious health-related suffering of 10 million Indians. We continue to do that by our strategy of "demonstrate, educate, facilitate" (DEF).

To start with the demonstration of palliative care delivery balancing quality and coverage, I am happy to report that we could care for 4874 unique patients in our demonstration centre in Trivandrum directly. And I am glad that when we celebrated World Hospice and Palliative Care Day, more than 500 of them and their families attended the get-together. The smiles on their faces reminded us of why our organization exists and why we do this work. My colleagues join me in renewing our pledge to keep the focus on them rather than the organization or any other consideration.

Realizing that what we do in our headquarters will reach only a tiny minority of people that we eventually want to reach, we concentrated on education. This year, we delivered our 100th virtual training session and reached 1153 healthcare providers through this mode. We also trained 74 doctors and 39 nurses in person.

Our facilitation team has been working hard to translate the work of demonstration and education into realities in various parts of the country. To achieve this, we worked with the governments of Indian states and union territories and with individuals and institutions to catalyse the development of, or collaborated in the functioning of 30 palliative care centres during this current year of report. One important part of this work was conducting opioid access workshops in seven different states. In each of them, the drug regulators, healthcare managers and healthcare providers got together to exchange notes, to bring problems to light and to find solutions. We have found this strategy to be most helpful and meaningful in bringing pain-relieving medications to those needing it most.



CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

At the same time, our team also worked in New Delhi to continue our efforts towards the implementation of the 2014 amendment of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act and to improve access to opioids for pain relief. For this, we worked with the Department of Revenue and the Department of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in New Delhi.

In the meantime, our 'strategic partnerships' activity has continued to build bridges with organizations in India and abroad. Many of the problems are common to all low and middle-income countries (LMICs), and we are quite convinced that it is essential to work together as a body advocating for access to quality care in LMICs. We are all part of one world and will work towards Rabindranath Tagore's vision of a world which is "not divided into tiny fragments by narrow domestic walls".



While our doctors and nurses were addressing the physical pain of our patients, our social work team has been working tirelessly to provide support in the form of monthly rations to 156 families, education support to 346 children, assistive devices to 262 beneficiaries, and assistance with house modification for six families.

A much-awaited dream; building a permanent building for Pallium India, the Pallium Home, is close to becoming a reality. We ended the year by procuring 69 cents of land by the generosity of our donors. We hope to see the Pallium home to be a reality in a couple of years.

Thank you for supporting us to reach our mission of wiping the tears on every face in serious health-related suffering.

Home for Pallium India - a reality

We are delighted to announce that our long-cherished dream of having a permanent home for Pallium India, the Pallium Home, is on the verge of coming true. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, especially Chittilappilly Foundation and other donors, we have acquired 69 cents of land for this purpose. We plan to start the construction by March 2024.



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Pallium India Wins International Recognition

Pallium India is among the three institutions that won this year's International Association for Hospice and Palliative Care (IAHPC) Institutional Recognition Awards, which celebrate institutions dedicated to developing and providing palliative care to improve patient's quality of life with serious health-related suffering.

While Pallium India won the award among middle-income countries, Hospice Africa Uganda (HAU) won the low-income country award, and Anam Cara House Colac, Australia, was selected winner among high-income countries. The award consists of a US\$1,000 cash prize and a one-year IAHPC institutional membership.

Pallium India receives Consultative Status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council

Pallium India has achieved Consultative Status (Special Category) with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). This prestigious recognition enables Pallium India to engage closely with the UN, offering expert advice and influencing the work of the Council and its subsidiary bodies.

The accreditation aligns with the UN's commitment to collaborate with accredited non-governmental organizations and supports global initiatives such as the Millennium Development Goals and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

ECOSOC serves as the primary gateway for NGOs to gain official recognition within the UN system, facilitating collaboration and the exchange of views.

Collaboration for balanced access to opioids: webinar on 29 April 2022

H.E Mr. Ghislain D'Hoop calls for pain relief and exhorts, "Leave no patient behind." Chairs of two Lancet Commissions – Felicia Knaul of Access to Pain Relief & Palliative Care 2017 and Keith N Humphreys of Opioid Governance 2022 – lay out the specifics.

This webinar, co-organised by the UN Office of Drugs and Crime (UNODC), the Vienna NGO Committee on Drugs (VNGOC) and the International Association for Hospice and Palliative Care (IAHPC) fills us with hope for the future. Instead of advocates for either addiction medicine or palliative medicine, let us hope, that we will have advocates for humanity and compassion.



World, focus on mitigation of suffering, or assist harm – Geripal Podcast



Dr. M.R. Rajagopal spoke on 12 May 2022 in GeriPal, a geriatrics and palliative care podcast at the University of California, San Francisco, created to showcase the "brightest minds in geriatrics, hospice, and palliative care."

He answered pertinent questions from hosts Dr. Eric Widera and Dr. Alex Smith, also joined by guest host Tom McNally, a rehab and pediatric palliative care doctor. Alex is a palliative medicine physician-researcher and Professor of Medicine. Eric is a clinician-educator in the University of California San Francisco Division of Geriatrics.

Queen's University and Pallium India Announce Partnership

Queen's Global Oncology, Queen's University, Kingston, Canada, and Pallium India have formalized their long-standing partnership to improve palliative care services in India through education, research, and policy initiatives.

The partnership between Queen's University and Pallium India began in 2016 when Queen's oncologist, Dr. Christopher Booth, traveled to Kerala, India, for a six-month sabbatical. After meeting the Founder and Chairman of Pallium India, Dr. M.R. Rajagopal, Dr. Booth was determined to foster collaboration between Queen's and Pallium. This partnership has continued to grow and expand, with support from the Pallium India team and members of the Global Oncology team within the School of Medicine's Department of Oncology at Queen's Health Sciences.





Joint statement by IAHPC and Pallium India

On August 30, 2022, Katherine Pettus, Senior Advocacy and Partnerships Director at the International Association for Hospice and Palliative Care (IAHPC), presented a joint statement on behalf of IAHPC and Pallium India at a UN Human Rights meeting.

Both organizations, with ECOSOC Consultative Status, advocated for the inclusion of the right to palliative care in the human rights discourse for older persons. The intervention emphasized that palliative care, including pain relief and holistic support, enables individuals, particularly older women, to participate fully in various aspects of life.


The statement underscored the necessity for agedisaggregated data on health-related suffering to plan for publicly provided palliative care and address the global shortage of essential medicines like morphine. The right to palliative care was emphasized as a crucial support for older persons to enjoy their fundamental rights.


Pallium India at the McGill International Congress on Palliative Care, Montreal.

Pallium India's virtual education team, represented by Rajalekshmi Balu and Dr. Sreedevi Warrier, presented their work virtually at the McGill International Palliative Care Congress, Montreal, Canada, held from Oct 18-21, 2022.

McGill University's International Congress on Palliative Care is the longest-running congress for this field and is now organized and hosted biennially by Palliative Care McGill. Over 1,500 delegates from more than 65 countries participated in making this one of the most interdisciplinary palliative care congresses.

Education of professionals and community stakeholders is the way forward for disseminating palliative care services in Low and Middle-Income Countries. Pallium India offers a number of virtual palliative care training programs for people working in diverse domains who wish to contribute to mitigating suffering.





Celebrating 100 Virtual Training Programmes



In March 2022, with the commencement of the 100th Virtual Training Program, Pallium India has crossed a significant milestone in its efforts to enable healthcare professionals to reduce unnecessary health-related suffering—a proud moment for the Virtual Education department at Pallium India.



Our virtual education journey that started in 2017, with the help of our partners Project ECHO and ECHO India, has enabled us to reach around 4500 individuals in 20 countries and all states of India.

The Award was formally received by Dr. Jagruti Kamdar, Vice President, Maharashtra State Chapter, on behalf of Dr. M.R. Rajagopal at the first international conference of NAPCAIM held at Sri Guru Ram Das University of Health Sciences, Amritsar, Punjab.



CME: Getting comfortable with Essential Narcotic Drugs in Chhattisgarh

The importance of pain management is known only to people who have gone through severe pain. You may not find it easy to believe this, but modern pain management got into the MBBS curriculum only a few years back. Doctors and hospital administrators do not yet know how to procure opioids or how to stock and dispense them safely. Nor do healthcare administrators.

Dr Shilpa Khanna from Sangwari in Chhattisgarh, having initiated palliative care services reaching out to the community, decided to sensitize medical professionals on the matter. On the 7th of July 2022, from 12 noon to 3 pm, she coordinated a hybrid event organized by the Department of Anaesthesia in collaboration with the Department of Medicine and Department of Paediatrics of Rajmata Srimati Devendra Kumari Singhdeo Government Medical College, Ambikapur. This is followed by extensive hand-holding and trouble-shooting on practical issues in smaller groups.

The 126 attendees included the Dean, Medical Superintendent, heads of Paediatrics and Gynaecology, senior faculty, senior residents, junior residents of various clinical and non-clinical departments, nurses in charge of OPD, IPD, OT, and ICU, central store in charge, pharmacists, dietician, and hospital management consultants and final year MBBS students. So, it is essential to sensitize all categories of stakeholders.



National nurses' team to prepare nursing modules on palliative care.

The Indian Nursing Council (INC) has commenced the process of integrating palliative care into the UG nursing curriculum, starting with the 2022 batch. According to the latest syllabus, a 20-hour mandatory module on Palliative Care is included in the 4th semester (second year) of the four-year BSc Nursing Course. Following this announcement, the Indian Nursing Council has published the course outline for the mandatory modules. Pallium India Education and Skill Building department is coordinating this project.

Opioid Availability Workshop and other developments in Puducherry

Union Territory of Puducherry has prioritized health most and strives to provide quality care at all three levels of mainstream healthcare.

However, access to pain relief and palliative care remains a challenge as the government has to prioritize the available limited resources. Addressing the need for quality palliative care in the union territory, Pallium India and Aarupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, in association with the Department of Drugs Control, Puducherry, conducted an "Opioid Availability" workshop for palliative care professionals, drug vendors and pharmacists of medical institutions in Puducherry.

This workshop shed light on the operational procedures to ensure the implementation of the amended NDPS rules 2015 to have uninterrupted access to pain relief in the union territory.



Dr. Rajagopal presented the case study of Kerala and the importance of the accountability of RMIs to avoid opioid misuse. The Drugs Controller presented the keynote address specifying the challenges and current scenario in Puducherry about purchasing/dispensing opioids for medical purposes. He talked about the NDPS Amendment Act in detail and the application process to obtain the recognized medical institution status. It was commendable to note that the Drugs controller talked from a facilitator perspective rather than from an enforcement authority, sharing the responsibility that stakeholders have to alleviate the pain relief of the suffering patients.

There was an interactive Q&A session with the drugs controller and Dr. Rajagopal, where drug vendors shared the logistical challenges of procuring opioids, and medical institutes asked about the documentation required for smooth drug availability.

The workshop was completed with high participation from drug vendors, retailers, medical institutes, and palliative care professionals (134 people). It was the first-of-its-kind event in the union territory where all the stakeholders came together under one roof to discuss the challenges and find solutions for easy opioid availability for medical use and safe usage of the same. Drugs controller suggested that a stakeholder network would be created from this workshop and similar meetings can be conducted in the future.

Pallium India takes this opportunity to thank the Govt. of Puducherry, the Controlling authority Dr. E Anandakirouchenane, the Association of Druggists & chemists association, and AVMC College for making this happen.

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Workshop on Opioid Availability in Rajasthan

In coordination with Dr. Anjum Khan Joad of BMCHRC (Bhagwan Mahaveer Cancer Hospital & Research Centre), Jaipur, Pallium India, organized a Workshop on Opioid availability in Rajasthan on 4th August 2022. 35 participants were present at the event, including Mr Ajay Pathak, State Drug Controller Rajasthan, and Dr Nirmala, Incharge Officer NPPC, NHM Rajasthan, and twenty doctors from government & and private sectors, Rajasthan.

Opioid availability workshops in Punjab and Jharkhand

On 25 August 2022, Pallium India organized an online workshop on Opioid Availability in Punjab, with support from Mr Sanjeev Garg, Joint Commissioner FDA Punjab.

In collaboration with Mrs. Ritu Sahay (Director Director, State Drug Control Directorate – SDCD, Jharkhand) and Dr. Sujit Kumar (Joint Director, SDCD Jharkhand), Pallium India organized an online workshop on Opioid availability in Jharkhand on September 5, 2022.

Opioid Workshop with Meghalaya Drugs Department

In January 2023, Meghalaya State Drug Department took the initiative to conduct an Opioid Workshop, facilitated by Pallium India.

Opioid Workshop in Ladakh

Pallium India organized an online opioid availability workshop for the Union Territory of Ladakh, facilitated by Dr M R Rajagopal (Chairman of Pallium India), on January 3, 2023. Mohd Bashir Bandey, (Drug Controller, Ladakh) attended the event, along with 24 other participants including Dr Sunil Kumar Ahirwar (Incharge officer, NPPC NHM), and Dr Tashi Thinlasand (Palliative care consultant, NCD Leh), Dr Rinchan Dolma DH Kargil and others from Leh and Kargil district hospitals of Ladakh.

10-day Foundation Training in Puducherry

Pallium India's Trivandrum Institute of Palliative Sciences (TIPS), the WHO Collaborating Centre for Training and Policy on Access to Pain Relief, in association with Aarupadai Veedu Medical College (AVMC) Puducherry, conducted a 10-day foundation training program for palliative care professionals (doctors and nurses) in the union territory of Puducherry. This course emphasizes the importance of psychosocial, emotional and spiritual issues along with physical problems in chronically ill patients.



These 10 days of foundation training for doctors and nurses enabled the participants to learn how to integrate palliative care's standard procedures into primary healthcare. The program's clinical posting was the most notable accomplishment which allowed participants to get firsthand exposure of the inpatient facilities and home care visits in nearby villages. This combined training initiative was a first-of-its-kind in Puducherry.

The 29 trainees who attended the program will be the flag bearers in their own institutions and in Puducherry to ensure appropriate palliative care is delivered.

Palliative Care training in Ladakh

Pallium India, in collaboration with Project ECHO India and National Health Mission (NHM) Ladakh, organized a palliative care sensitization workshop for Community Health Officers (CHO) across Ladakh in February and March 2023.

120 CHOs, including medical officers and nurses, were trained in the different aspects of Palliative Care by Dr. Anjum Joad Khan and Dr Minhaj Akhter of Bhagwan Mahaveer Cancer Hospital and Research Centre, Jaipur. Other speakers at the event included Mr. Gylax (State Program Officer, NHM Ladhak), Dr. Sandeep Bhalla (Associate Vice President, ECHO India), Dr. Iftakhar Ahmed Chowdhary (NHM, Ladakh), and Dr. Fajar Shah (ECHO India).

Dr Rajagopal receives Best Doctor Award



Chairman of Pallium India, Dr M R Rajagopal was one of the recipients of the Best Doctor award instituted by the Nehru Group of Institutions and the P K Das Institute of Medical Sciences (PKDIMS), Vaniyamkulam, in memory of Nehru group founder P.K. Das. The awards were presented at a function hosted by the PKDIMS on January 14, 2023.

6 doctors from Kerala and 3 doctors from Tamil Nadu were selected for the awards considering their services in four categories.

Athulya Senior Care and Pallium India have collaborated to launch palliative care services in the organized senior care sector across South India





Pallium India's trustee, Ashla Rani received the second Znehazandram Excellence Award instituted by the Kozhikodebased Zmart Foundation for inspiring personalities. Ashla, 39, was selected in recognition of her advocacy for disability rights in India.



The award was presented on November 11th at the Pallium India office in Trivandrum by Dr. Biju Jacob IA&AS (Principal Accountant General, Kerala) in the presence of Dr. Beena Oommen and Dr. Alex Oommen (ZMART Foundation Trustees). Fr. Koshy Alexander Ashby and Chairman Dr M. R. Rajagopal. Pallium India's staff, volunteers and well-wishers joined the program in person or via zoom.

"I feel honored to receive this award in memory of Sandra. The award goes to team Pallium India and to my mother, who enables me to do my bit," said Ashla Rani.

7-day residential camp

The annual National Service Scheme 7-day VHSE (Vocational Higher Secondary Education) school's residential camp began on December 26, 2022. The camp implemented various social welfare projects state-wide. One of the ambitious social welfare projects was "SAMARPITHAM," which aimed to sensitize young minds to palliative care and motivate them to understand and address the problems of palliative care beneficiaries.

SAMARPITHAM was carried out with the support of Pallium India and IAPC Kerala Chapter across 338 schools across Kerala. Through the project, students were trained in the basics of palliative care and visited palliative care beneficiaries near their campsite. Statewide, around 4 lakh students benefited from the project.

Pallium India was able to reach 26 VHSE schools in Thiruvananthapuram District.



Donation by Siemens Healthineers



Siemens Healthineers has donated protective gear to Government Medical College Hospital, Thiruvananthapuram, facilitated by Pallium India. The medical equipment included 6000 protective eyewear, 9000 shoe covers, and 3000 protective body suits. The formal handover was organized at Government Medical College on March 20, 2023.

Govt. Medical College Principal Prof. Dr. Kala Kesavan, Dr Anil Sundaram (Deputy Superintendent) and Mohan Roy (Resident Medical Officer) attended. Dr. Sunil Kumar M M (Additional Director, TIPS, Pallium India), Dr Sangeetha Suresh (Palliative Care Physician, Pallium India), Mr Sourav Singh (Lead – Resource Mobilization, Pallium India) and others were also part of this handover ceremony.

Pallium India runs a Palliative Care Outpatient Clinic at Govt. Medical College Hospital.

Community Physiotherapy



As Pallium India looks after all patients with serious healthrelated suffering, we have various patients suffering from cancer, stroke, paraplegia, muscular dystrophies, frailty, etc. In some of these conditions, physiotherapy can help the patient come to the mainstream by improving mobility and social function.

However, some patients find physiotherapy unaffordable and end up with more complications. For such cases, Pallium India provides physiotherapy at their homes to improve their quality of life. The Community Physiotherapy (CPT) program was started by a community physiotherapist in Poovar Link Center, offering five sessions per day, thrice a week. CPT was started in mid-November 2021, supported by the Azim Premji Foundation. Due to the benefits of this program, we extended CPT to 3 more link centers in July 2022. We currently have 4 CPTs working in 7 link centers in Trivandrum District.

Stroke Rehabilitation Program

Pallium India has collaborated with the Department of Neurology at Medical College Hospital, Trivandrum, to initiate a Palliative Care Stroke Integrated Program with Neuromedicine Unit 1.

The project focuses on admitting willing patients with recent strokes to Pallium India's inpatient unit for rehabilitation after the acute phase. Over nine months, there were 69 referrals, and 28 patients were admitted for rehabilitation.

Preliminary data analysis indicates a promising improvement in the quality of life and reduced mortality risk for them.

Additionally, a joint Outpatient Unit for stroke patient review was established in April 2022, held every 1st Wednesday of the month. This outpatient clinic involves collaboration between the Neurology Department and Pallium India's team, including a palliative care physician, physiatrist, physiotherapist, social officer, and nurse.

The Neuro Project has registered around 93 patients in nine months from the Neuro Medicine Unit. The project is scheduled for completion in May 2023.

Migrated to a new Hospital Management System

We migrated to a brand new Hospital Management System (HMS) and digitized all our medical records, enabling us to work smarter and with more efficiency. We will also be becoming paperless soon.

Community Nursing

Pallium India introduced the Community Nurse (CN) Program under the Home Care project, funded by the Azim Premji Foundation. The program aimed to ensure quality palliative care delivery to registered and new patients in specific communities.

Trained community nurses, using two-wheelers, visited patients five days a week. Once a week, the nurse reported to the Trivandrum Institute of Palliative Sciences (TIPS) for monitoring and evaluation.

Launched in Bharatanoor and Palode link centers in April 2022, on average, the CN visited 180 patients per month in the communities served.

Regular evaluation at TIPS ensured program effectiveness, and a study conducted after ten months highlighted positive impacts on palliative care delivery.

A few takeaways from the study:

1. Visits aligned with the review schedule, ensuring timely patient care.

2. Increased visit frequency with CN support led to improved quality of care.

3. New patient registrations rose by 43.6% in Bharatanoor and 59.3% in Palode.



4. Cost analysis showed 65.8% and 36.6% cost benefits in Bharatanoor and Palode, respectively. Savings: ₹3,43,680 in Bharatanoor, ₹1,45,524 in Palode annually.

5. The introduction of CN significantly reduced the need for the Field Support Team.

6. Due to benefits, the CN program was extended to the Poovar link center in August 2022.

Dancing to relieve suffering

The students and faculty of the School of Indian Dance in California decided that everyone has a part to play in relieving needless suffering in India. They danced and baked to raise money, and Pallium India gratefully received more than \$4000.


